

# NEWS OF PEACE Peace Lutheran Church, Steeleville, IL 2025



Dear Friends,

This month we celebrate the high holy days of Christianity. During Holy Week and Easter, we celebrate the gift of our salvation in the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. Easter, the Resurrection of Our Lord, is both the primary and initial festival of the church. It was the first feast celebrated! In fact, the whole Church year is centered in the church's celebration of Easter.

On the **Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday), April 13**, we assemble to worship our Lord Jesus who is both Suffering Servant and King and royal Lord. On this day the center of our worship service is not so much the procession with palms as it is **the Proclamation of the Passion of Our Lord.** Hence, the name change from Palm Sunday to Sunday of the Passion.

On **Maundy Thursday**, **April 17**, we will gather to commemorate the end of the days of Lent and the beginning of the Great Three Days (Triduum) from Maundy Thursday evening until Easter Sunday evening. The service of the Three Days is one service celebrated over three days. Using the Jewish ordering of time, the day begins as sunset and concludes at the following sunset. So Maundy Thursday (**Day One**) begins at sunset on Thursday and ends at sunset on Friday. **Day Two** of the Three Days extends from Friday at sunset to Saturday at sunset. **Day Three** begins at sunset on Saturday and concludes on Sunday at sunset. (This is why we can have Sunday services on Saturday evening. Our Christian Sunday begins at sundown on Saturday and ends on Sunday at sundown.)

On **Good Friday**, **April 18**, we will gather for the second part of the Service of the Three Days. We will once again hear the **Proclamation of the Passion from John's Gospel**, followed by the showing of the cross. On this day we solemnly remember the cost our Lord paid for our sins as we also celebrate the triumph of his victory over sin and death. The service of the day concludes on a note of Triumph rather than sadness.

The Resurrection of our Lord (Easter Sunday) is April 20. At the beginning of our Easter 6 a.m. service, we will conclude the Service of the Three Days with the Service of Light at which time we prepare and light the Paschal Candle and Renew our Baptismal Promises. This is the first Eucharist of Easter. The 9 a.m. Service will be our Festival Service of Easter. First Communion will be celebrated at this service! What a joy that will be when our young people receive our Lord in Holy Communion for the first time at the High Holy Festival of the Church Year!

As your Pastor, I encourage you to take spiritual advantage of these days. Celebrate them with one another by joining together in prayer and worship. These days define who we are as Christians. Make every effort to participate in all the services of Thursday, Friday of Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Come, together let us enter into the joy of our Lord!








#### **FIRST COMMUNION:** First
