SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING
Flooring for the Lower Level

We will hold a special Congregational Meeting to act on a recent Church Council recommendation regarding the replacement of the flooring of the lower level: the fellowship hall, bathrooms and hallways. The meeting will be held on Sunday, December 7th at 10 a.m. Please make every effort to attend this important meeting in the life of our church.

BASEMENT RENOVATION FUNDING CAMPAIGN

Much needed basement renovations are coming! For many years, the flooring and walls in the Fellowship Hall, restrooms, and hallways in the basement have deteriorated badly. The underlying problem seemed to come from water leakage from outside the building. The Property Committee has been diligently working on this problem, and the end of water leakage is in sight.

We will be holding a specially-called congregational meeting at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, December 7, 2025 to vote on proceeding with the needed renovations. We need a quorum of 50 members to vote; it is very important that you attend the meeting.

The quoted cost of the new flooring is \$30,741.80. In addition, the Fellowship Hall bathroom walls will be repaired and all walls in areas designated for new flooring will be painted. The total cost estimate is between \$40,000 to \$45,000. We have some of the money needed to cover these costs but need your help to raise the additional funds required. Please give generously as you are able. Any donations for this project should be marked "Basement Renovation Fund."

Parish Confirmation


Confirmation classes will continue on December 7th, December 14th and December 21st. There are no classes on December 28th, & January 4th
